Visiting Exchange Students To Tour Southern India



While the local folks are bundling up against our frigid February, our latest exchange student update might warm us. It comes from western India where the daytime highs are regularly topping 90 and approaching 100 degrees while the overnight lows range around 70.

Gilbertsville-Mount Upton CS's Chelsea DeForest traveled across India's north earlier in the fall. In a recent e-mail, she provided the itinerary for an upcoming tour that the exchange students will be taking through the country's south.

Here's the south India Tour itinerary! It's from March 17th until April 1st.

Day 1: (3/17) Baroda to Bangalore

All day in train at 16:45 hrs. Overnight stay on train.

Day 2: (3/18) Train

Full day in train, overnight in train. (ugh!)

Day 3: (3/19) Bangalore

Arrive at 4 AM in Bangalore City. Bangalore City local sightseeing. Overnight stay in Bangalore.

Day 4: (3/20) Bangalore to Mysore

[4 hour drive] En route visit to Sravanbelgola, Hassan and Helibid. Evening free at leisure. Overnight stay in Mysore.

Day 5: (3/21) Mysore

Local sightseeing. Evening visit to Brindavan Garden (B-E-A-U-TIFUL!!!). Overnight stay in Mysore.

Day 6: (3/22) Mysore to Mandurai

[9 hour drive] Sightseeing (if possible), visit to Meenakshi Temple. Overnight stay in Mandurai.

Day 7: (3/23) Mandurai to Thekkady

[Non-stop 5 hour drive] Visit Periyar Wildlife Sanctuary. Overnight stay in Thekkady.

Day & (3/24) Thekkady to Alleppy or Kottayam (Back Waters)

[3 hour drive to Alleppy] Same day, sunset boat ride manual hand boat in Vembanad Lake!!!! Overnight stay in either Alleppy or Kottayam.

Day 9: (3/25) Alleppy or Kottayam to Munnar

[4 hour drive] Local sightseeing. Overnight stay in Munnar.

Day 10: (3/26) Munnar

Half day more local sightseeing. Evening free at leisure. Overnight stay in Munnar.

Day 11: (3/27) Munnar to Cochin

[5 hour drive] Local sightseeing. Evening free at leisure. Overnight stay in Cochin.

Day 12: (3/28) Train to Goa

Morning, more local sightseeing, then depart to the train station and go to Goa (where we can eat some beefy BEEF!!!). Overnight on train ...again

Day 13: (3/29) Goa

Morning arrive in Goa, go to hotel by coach, sightseeing/shopping/eating/having a good time in Goa. Overnight in Goa.

Day 14:(3/30) Goa

Full day North and South Goa tour! Overnight again in Goa!

Day 15: (3/31) Goa to Baroda (Train)

Go to train. Depart for baroda.

Day 16: (4/1) Vapi, Surat, Bharuch, Baroda

Morning arrival to the convenient cities with lingering good memories of our fantastic tour!
