BU Rotaract Club

Every month, DG **Lana Rouff** honors one of the clubs in the Southern Tier for its achievements. Slightly breaking from tradition, in May she turned to a Rotary-sponsored group of future leaders, the Rotoract Club at Binghamton University. Rotoract is for men and women ages 18-30.

A tiny girl with a bright smile and tenacity way beyond her size, Bianca Kapadia, a BU sophomore, is the president of Binghamton University's Rotaract Club. She is responsible for creating the club and happily saw it chartered this past July.

Sponsored by the Binghamton Noon Club, this club has twenty members and excels in "Service Above Self!" They have raised money for Polioplus by selling Iollipops and candles and sold Polioplus pins at the district conference.

Currently they help the City of Binghamton create community gardens through its VINES program, and are heavily involved in mentoring at risk children after school. Some of their members have been trained to work with mentally challenged kids and even volunteer to serve meals at the annual Volunteer Recognition Dinner held at the Senior Vestal Center.

Members of this club are the Rotarians of the future, and we are pleased to have them in our district.

Kate Meyers Wins Award

Morris Rotary sponsored two ambassadors to study abroad this year. Chelsea DeForest has spent several months in Surat, India. But his week's big news comes from Belgium where Kate Meyers was honored.

The announcement arrived in an e-mail to YEP officers worldwide from former Belgian YEP chairman **Philippe M. Caron**. It was sent to *YEO Talk* which is subscribed to the whole Youth Exchange World.

Dear Youth Exchange Officers and friends,

Some of you will remember that District 1620 has designed a special "Outstanding YE Student" pin and a corresponding document.

For the second year now, our clubs and the district have selected the "Best Students of the Year".

The pins, the documents and the reward have been solemnly handed over, on stage, to the 8 inbound finalists at the district conference last weekend by the representative of the international president, the governor and the governor elect.

It is our great pleasure to mention that this year our best student was Miss Kaitlin MEYERS, sponsored by RC of MOR-RIS (NY), USA in District 7170 and hosted by RC of GENT-ZUID, Belgium.

It is worth mentioning that Kaitlin, before she knew she was nominated, directed a remarkable speech in Dutch to the 400 people participating in the district conference. A speech in French was delivered by a Colombian student.

She was introduced with the following words "From the beginning Kaitlin was particularly motivated to learn and use the Dutch language. According to one of her teachers, she was an asset for her school and certainly an example for her schoolmates. For the hosting club, who had a bad experience with Youth Exchange a few years ago, she was an inspiration to start welcoming YE students on a regular basis again."



Kaitlin has received a reward of 500 euro, to be used against the purchase of a flight ticket back to Belgium within the next two years.

The closing of the district conference was a song interpreted by our 60 inbound students and the organizing club.

I cannot stress enough the positive repercussion of this ceremony on the D1620 clubs in terms of program participation.

The "Outstanding YE Student" pin design, approved by RI, is freely available on request. We had it produced in India.
