Next In Rotary Service: Do You Know The Four-Way Test? President Gary Will Ask. Announcements & Club Assembly — Hank Rehrmann reported that renovations have started on the Lynn Tractor Building. The crew has set Monday afternoons for its weekly work session. They are also considering a proposal to use the rear of the building as a storage area for Rotary equipment. --- President Gary announced that he has received commitments from some of the Rotarians he has asked to lead committees. Other positions have yet to be filled. The full list of committees is not yet available. ---President Gary then distributed a proposed calendar of the year's major events and asked for club input. It was pointed out that the date of the Morris Central School Open House might be rescheduled by the district so the date of the Pork Supper might be changed, too. School authorities will be contacted for this revision. No one else offered any suggestions for additional projects or date changes. ---Harry Graves expressed two concerns about producing the newsletter, 1) gathering information and 2) the printing of the physical product. He said he wanted to be a "publisher" but not a "reporter". He asked that all project chairmen commit to promptly provide written details/results of their events. On the distribution issue, Harry stated that electronic delivery works well to computer-savvy members and to others in District 7170. Now that he has retired, he no longer has weekly use of his employer's high-speed printer. He proposed that a copier given to the club by Bill and Teresa be set up so the newsletter could be copied at the Town House each week. He further suggested that a budget line be created to cover printing expenses. President Gary reported that PDG Fred had offered to print copies for the few members who still don't use computers. Rotarian Harry said that he would continue to write the newsletter for a few more to see if the bigger problems can be resolved. --- The gift of server space for a club website was again offered. President Gary responded by appointing Bill and Teresa, Matt Meyers, and future member Carl Harris to work with Harry to decide what items should be included on the website. They would also establish a plan allow the site to be useful to many members.

Tom Morgan's family owned the Empire Hotel in Gilbertsville for many years. In his poignant one-man play, adapted from his own autobiographical stories published in his newspaper columns and included on *Moneytalk*, Tom portrays some of the characters and events from his family's time there in this powerful stage debut.

Tom has produced his radio show for over thirty years and has been writing his column for twenty. His TV show appeared for several years on various PBS stations, while G.P. Putnam's published his book *Money Money Money* in hardcover. Tom's writing has also appeared in the Writer's Digest anthology *Just Open a Vein*.



Franklin Stage Company is located in Chapel Hall at 25 Institute Street in Franklin.
