**Program** — The experience of a year abroad is likely to have a major impact on any student. Her time in India made a strong impression on G-MU graduate Chelsea DeForest. Coming from a Mount Upton address with a weekend job at a veterinary hospital, Chelsea suddenly found herself in Surat with its teeming millions. During her time in the country, Chelsea and the other exchange students took trips to the north and south of Indian, experiencing mountains (Himalayas), deserts, unrestrained wild-life, and one of man's grandest structures (Taj Mahal).

## Her observations:

- + She wore uniforms in school but quickly became accustomed to India's "everyday wear", clothing that was very inexpensive. She also learned to bargain with merchants for the items she wanted.
- + Table manners were interesting. Every action was taken with the right hand, the "clean hand". Many food items, all spicy, are eaten by hand even in formal situations. And staying with four Hindu families, she didn't eat beef for 10 months.
- + The temperature soured to near 110 degrees for much of her stay. And in an area impacted by monsoons, she didn't see rain from September until her return to the States in June.
- + Her most irritating moment came when TV coverage of President Obama's inauguration was interrupted. Electricity black-outs are common but this time the culprit was a pack of monkeys playing with antenna wires on the roof.

Chelsea brought her prepared "program" on a computer memory stick. The club didn't have the equipment to show her pictures. She'll be back on July 27 when we'll have the equipment she needs.

# **Fred Nelson Passes**

The club was saddened by the passing of former member Frederick Raymond Nelson, age 87. A longtime Rotarian, Fred served as president during the 1981-1982 term. He was a well-known insurance claims adjuster in the area. Following his retirement, he stayed active in the community driving school bus at MCS. He was predeceased by Jane (Shelly), his wife of nearly 60 years.
