## Committee Report

# MRC Website Needs

The world has moved into the Information Age. Most RI materials are now available to be downloaded from the internet. Many clubs and districts promote their activities on their own sites. After discussing the matter with internet-savvy members for years, member **Harry Graves** last year offered to donate server space to the club for a website. He made the offer again to the new administration.

President Gary has formed a committee to look into the details of the offer. A group of Morris Rotarians met last week to define the club's needs so a website could be designed to meet the members' wishes. The site is currently under development; a draft will be presented to the club later in the summer for member input.

Here are the group's initial thoughts.

**1.** Any MRC site should be clean and simple in design ... and easy for the user to navigate. It is intended to become a primary source of MRC materials.

2. The site's main purpose should be to present a positive image and current information to the community. Secondarily, it should be a reference source for members of the Morris Rotary Club. Of least importance is rest of the Rotary world. Our site should not be cluttered with too much general Rotary information which is already available elsewhere.

**3.** Upcoming projects and/or recent news should take priority and be the site's principle postings.

**4**. Although most updates may be handled by one or two members, a "website administration committee" will be formed to oversee the site. At least four (4) club members who are committed to publicizing the club will have logon access.

**5.** The site is a gift of member Graves with all expenses presently covered. Any future costs will be presented to the club's Board of Directors by the Website Committee for inclusion in future budgets.

**6.** To keep the site very user-friendly, the site will <u>not</u> have password protection. (This may change as more members become comfortable with computers.) However, some simple protections will be established.

Some items (such as posters for upcoming events) will be "locked" in a PDF (or similar) format. Club members will be encouraged to copy and post/distribute these publications.

Other basic forms of completed (or on-going) projects will be stored in "unlocked" formats (such as Word or Excel) and are intended to copied/downloaded, then updated for the "next event" These basic forms are intended to be a "library of tools" to be used by all members/chairmen as needed.

**7.** The website will be presented to both the Board of Directors and to the general membership for discussion and member-input before any final decisions are made by the BOD.

**8.** Training classes will be required for all members of the "website administration committee". In addition, a class(s) will be offered to MRC members on navigating the site and use of its stored materials.
