**Program** — With a new superintendent, a new high school principal, and more than a dozen new teachers, the annual New Teacher dinner was a gala affair. It was held in the community room in the basement of the First Presbyterian Church in Gilbertsville.

New MCS superintendent Matthew Sheldon was introduced by his predecessor **Mike Virgil**. Glenn Hamilton, in his second year at GMU, familiarized club members with high school principal Annette Hammond who comes to the district from Sidney. The teachers were introduced from the tables by Rotarians who drew many laughs by digging up interesting tidbits about the new faculty members.

When discussing their districts, Glenn Hamilton spoke on the building projects at Gilbertsville-Mount Upton. Some of the many renovations include additions to the music, elementary classroom, and technology areas. Outdoors, the district will be getting a six-lane track.

Matt Sheldon, who was an exchange student to Sweden under the Rotary program when he was a teen growing up in Otego, commented on the academic enhancements at Morris Central. Most rooms are now equipped with new Smartboards to expand the district's ability to display computer and internet information. The district is getting an enrichment program for students with special talents. Also, there will be several initiatives in mathematics in the year ahead. He spoke with pride that MCS is a School of Distinction for the high achievements of its student-athletes, one of only 13 such districts in NYS.
