
Remembering...

This Week - November 02, 2009

We dropped back to Standard Time over the weekend so it's getting dark earlier. And, there's a full moon tonight. Sidney High School astronomy teacher Rich Townsend will be here to offer some tips on backyard star gazing.



Program — A few short minutes of preparation this fall can save a lot of "won't start" headaches with your garden equipment next spring. The club called on the local John Deere dealer for suggestions. Tom Ives of Cazenovia Equipment Company (formerly Valley Supply) in South New Berlin offered steps that should be taken in the fall on tillers, lawn mowers, and garden tractors. He recommended a few simple steps.

- + Add a good fuel stabilizer to the gas tank to keep fuel from breaking down. (He recommends running all of the gas-oil mix out of small engines like weed eaters and chain saws.)
- + Store batteries indoors to prevent them from freezing. Charge them periodically.
- + If leaky tires are a problem, put the machine on blocks to take the weight off those tires.
- + Clean all debris out of the engine and from under the mower deck. Decks will rust from accumulated wet clippings. Scrape off all dried-on clippings and wash the deck clean.
- + Spray a commercial "deck cleaner" (or Pam) on the inside of the deck to prevent future build-up.

Neighbors — The **Norwich Rotary Club** has started its annual citrus sale. Being one of the area's only autumn fruit sales, it's the club's largest single fund-raiser. Orders will be taken for Navel and Hamlin oranges and Pink grapefruit until noon on Tuesday, November 17. Large 4/5 bushel boxes are \$25; the smaller 2/5 bushel boxes are \$18. The fruit will be delivered to the refrigerated warehouse at Norwich Beverage Company on Route 23 next to Sidney Federal Credit Union. It will be available for pick-up on Friday, December 4. --- Also conducting a holiday fund-raiser is the Sidney Rotary Club. They have assembled 20 beautiful gift baskets to be raffled off to fund their scholarship program. The baskets were created along such diverse themes as "Italian Treats", "Tailgate Party", "Teas", "Christmas", "Thanksgiving", and even "Cat Products". They'll be on display at various locations around the community until the drawing on November 17.

Club Service — Time and again, various members of the club have suggested that we record all of the steps that have to be taken to complete MRC projects. **Sharon Bosco** has agreed to undertake the job of recording MRC processes. The goal is to have a written record that a new chairman could follow to give the club a better chance of success events in future years. The data should include suggestions for recommended changes.

President Gary has further initiated a plan to train all new members on the workings of our existing committees. He is asking a newer member to serve as "vice-chairman" of each project to learn from the veteran chairman. **Maureen Kranbuhl** worked with Rotarian Mike on the Halloween Party. She and **Joanne Long** were also involved with all aspects of the New Teacher dinner with Chairman Harry. When returning from Florida next spring, Joanne will work with Rotarian Jim to update and store the club's longneglected scrapbooks. Other members will be asked to learn the workings of MRC commitments as they occur.

Throughout the year, Chairman Sharon will be contacting the leaders of all projects — both fund-raisers and service projects — to identify and document all the tasks that need to be remembered. She will not be asking for the names of people who have worked in the past...but will concentrate on the tasks to be performed, such things as "order the cider" or "print judging sheets". She will keep these "task lists" in a central location for use by future chairmen. The results will also be stored digitally.

President Gary is continuing the long-range planning efforts of Past-president Jeff. Gary asks all chairmen to assist by preparing written lists of tasks for Sharon. She'll also be collecting copies of forms or posters that we use.
