Landmarks included Rotary headquarters in Evanston, IL; the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Galicia, Spain; the Old Port Captain's Office on the V&A Waterfront in Cape Town; the Obelisk of Buenos Aires, Argentina; and the Royal Palace at Caserta, Italy. **Do you recognize the landmarks in this collage?**
