
This Week – March 8, 2010

District 7170 — The District 7170 YEP committee has been in the local papers this past week. The occasion was announced by YEP chairman **Tom Overbaugh**. *I am* proud to inform you that at the NAYEN Conference held in Chicago this past week-end D7170 was awarded the Dr Abe Kuttothara Outstanding District Award. This award is given to only one district each year within the North American Youth Exchange Network which includes all of the USA, Mexico and Canada. Locals **Dick** and **Mary Breuninger** have been members of the district YEP committee for three decades.

YEP Report — District 7170 sent a student to Chile this year. Coordinator **Sandy Dain** says everyone is safe. *I* have been in contact with Olivia Powell's mother. Olivia is fine. She is in the village of La Ligua which is 10 hours north of Concepcion. They felt the earthquake and some things fell off the wall. She and her host family got up and run outside. They waited and when no more happened they did go back inside but did not sleep. They don't have any power or water. So no internet but she did get a phone call to her mother yesterday morning. I will let the group know if I hear anything more.

Kicking Out Polio

In the lead-up to the FIFA World Cup in South Africa this summer, Rotary clubs across Africa are gearing up for the final push to kick polio out of the continent.

In Cape Town, a Pan-African "Kick Polio Out of Africa" awareness campaign was launched on February 23rd with the symbolic kicking of a ball signed by Emeritus Archbishop Desmond Tutu, who himself had polio as a child, and has joined Rotary's campaign as polio goodwill ambassador.



From Cape Town, one of the host cities to the 2010 World Cup, the ball will travel through 22 polio-affected countries to Cairo en route to the Rotary International Convention in Montréal, Canada in June. The journey is being underwritten by DHL Express.

Riding The Susquehanna & The Unadilla

It may be a few weeks before the rivers are completely clear of ice but the serious canoeists are already training. MCS technology teacher Mike Packard has been on his rowing machine all winter to stay in condition for the season ahead.

Packard has raced in most of the nation's premier long-distance events including the 70 miler at the General Clinton canoe regatta over Memorial Day weekend. The hot-bed of canoe racing seems to be the Northeastern states, Michigan, and Canada.

He brought both his canoe and his training machine to show Morris Rotarians and Cub Scouts. (The scouts were invited to see the presentation since it aligned with their emphasis on outdoor activities. They later went upstairs for dessert.) Packard emphasized the strong materials used in today's equipment and the audience was amazed at how light the canoe and paddles were. He displayed several paddles that had been manufactured by Al Camp of Otego or Bob Zaveral of Mount Upton, both respected names in competitive canoeing.
