# The Boy Scouts Of America – 100 Years Old

The concept of scouting was started in England by Baden Powell. Unadilla Episcopal minister Yale Lyon liked the enthusiasm he had seen among British youth so he organized a similar troop of five boys in Unadilla in April, 1910. That early start has earned Unadilla the honor of being known as Troop 1. Scoutmaster Brain Danforth says the troop has the nation's oldest continuous charter.

Danforth, wearing a replica of the military-style uniforms of early scouting, related the history of the troop and displayed several museum items, including an early copy of the handbook which has guided scouts for decades. From the start, there was an emphasis on outdoor adventures. Today, there are wide-ranging activities and boys can work toward any of 121 merit badges.

Leader Danforth says the troop is gearing up for several century events this spring, including a large encampment. Some 50 troops and packs are expected to descend on Unadilla's Community Field on the weekend of May 14-16 for a regional event. Saturday activities include a centennial parade and various displays. Local leaders say the scouts troops from both Morris and Gilbertsville will be participating.
