From Our Community - Former Morris Mustang coach Tom Moriarty was inducted into the Section IV Hall of Fame earlier this month. He was recognized for a 38 year coaching career at several area schools

He coached the Mustangs' boys basketball team to a 54-9 record in a span from 1972-75. Under Moriarty, MCS won Tri-Valley League and Section IV titles in addition to being a NYS Regional runner-up in 1975.

He went on to coach the Unatego boys varsity, served as an assistant coach at Hartwick College in the 1980s, and moved to mentor the Oneonta High girls program in the 1990s before landing his current position as an assistant with the SUNY Oneonta Ladies' Red Dragon teams.

Moriarty has previously been recognized as Section IV Coach of the Year ('77), served as NYS Coach of the Year ('97 & '98), and three times honored as a Coach of the Year by the Oneonta and Binghamton newspapers.

Program — Speaker Dick Germond grew up in the Sidney area but spent most of his working years in Southern California. During that time, he and a group of golfing friends routinely played at many of the 180 golf courses in the Palm Springs-Coachella Valley area. Although a member of the Sidney Golf & Country Club, he has the urge to experience many of the fine courses across New York's Southern Tier. It's the main reason behind starting the new league, Out'n About Players Touring Golf League.

Dick and another golfing friend have organized the touring league for 18 Thursdays this summer. Rarely will the group return to a course. Play starts at the Conklin Players Club on May 13 and continues at various area courses each week until the league's End-of-Season Tournament & Awards Dinner on Friday, September 17th at the very scenic Canasawacta Country Club in Norwich.

The group will play at 15 golf courses in Broome, Chenango, Delaware, Otsego and Tioga counties, all at specially negotiated rates. It will be handicapped match play with 2-man teams. Early registration is encouraged since the number of teams will be limited to 18. Cash prizes will be paid to the top four finishers during regular season play and in the End-of-Season Tournament.
