Reminder — There will be no speaker on April 12. It's a work session to prepare for Tuesday's dinner for scouting.


District 7170 —

They flew the 6,000 mile polar route from JFK Airport over Siberia to Beijing, a jaunt of 13 ½ hours. China is a country roughly the size of the United States. However, despite being about one-third desert, China has a population of 1.4 billion people compared to about 307 million in the USA.

During their time in Beijing and Shanghai the sisters climbed the Great Wall, rode the Bullet Train, marveled at China's temples, sampled the nation's dining, and toured landmarks such as Beijing's Tian'anmen Square (literally Gate of Heavenly Peace), the world's largest city square.
